

Your options for new teeth

Four ways to replace a full arch of teeth on dental implants — what each one includes, what it costs, and what costs extra.

The surgery is the same whichever option you choose. We remove the teeth that are left, reshape the bone underneath, and place four implants. You go home the same day with a fixed set of teeth. What changes between the options is the teeth that go on top — and when you pay for them.

ALL PRICES ARE PER ARCH

An arch is your whole upper jaw or your whole lower jaw. If you are treating both, that is two arches.

TREATING BOTH ARCHES

Save \$1,500–\$2,000 when both are done together. They share one surgery and one set of records, so the second arch costs less.

Implants are not your only option. A removable denture, a different repair, or no treatment at all can all be reasonable choices. We will go through the alternatives that apply to you at your consultation.



FINISHED ZIRCONIA TEETH

The four options

Every option includes your consultation, 3D scan, removing the teeth that are left, reshaping the bone ridge, routine bone grafting at the implant sites, up to four implants, and fixed teeth attached the same day.

OPTION 1 · THE STARTING POINT

Foundation

\$9,999

/ arch

Surgery plus a strong temporary set of teeth

- Consultation, 3D scan, and a written treatment plan with a written price
- Removing the teeth that are left, and reshaping the bone ridge
- Routine bone grafting at the implant sites
- Up to four implants
- A strong temporary set of teeth, fixed in place the same day
- All follow-up visits while you heal
- Numbing (local anesthetic). Sleep sedation costs extra

The teeth in this option are a strong temporary set, not the final zirconia. They are built to carry you through healing. Most people upgrade within a year.

OPTION 2 · THE FINISHED RESULT

Zirconia

\$14,999

/ arch

Chosen up front, at planning

- Everything in Foundation
- Your final teeth in zirconia — a solid ceramic that does not stain, wear down, or chip the way an acrylic set will
- The fitting appointments: records, try-in, and delivery
- A nightguard to protect them
- A full year of adjustments after your teeth are fitted
- Sleep sedation available depending on your medical history, at extra cost

This is the finished result. Nothing further to pay on the teeth themselves.

OPTION 3 · UPGRADE LATER

Zirconia Conversion

\$4,999

/ arch

Within 12 months of your surgery

- For Foundation patients moving up to final zirconia teeth
- Your final zirconia teeth, try-in, and fitting
- A nightguard, fitted when your teeth are delivered
- Foundation (\$9,999) plus this upgrade (\$4,999) comes to \$14,998 per arch — a dollar under choosing Zirconia up front

New scans and records are a separate fee. Ask us for that amount in writing, along with the price after 12 months, before you decide. This price goes up after 12 months.

OPTION 4 · WHEN MORE IS NEEDED

Enhanced

\$19,999–\$24,999

/ arch

When your jaw needs more than the standard surgery

- Everything in the Zirconia option
- Sleep sedation, where your medical history allows it
- More than four implants, where the bone needs them
- Difficult extractions, larger bone grafts, or sinus work
- Implants angled or anchored further back to reach stronger bone, which often avoids a graft
- A titanium framework inside the zirconia, if your bite needs it

This is not an upsell. It is a different amount of surgery. Your 3D scan decides whether you need any of it, and we explain it to you before treatment starts.

Your option and your final price are set after your examination and 3D scan. Anything recommended beyond the base option is explained first — what it is, why you need it, whether it is required or optional, and what it costs.

What happens, and when you pay

The first four steps are the same in every option

1 Consultation

Exam, photographs, and a 3D scan. You leave with a written plan and a written price.

1 VISIT · 90 MIN

2 Planning

Your new teeth are designed and a surgical guide is made. You choose your option here.

2-4 WEEKS

3 Surgery day

Teeth out, bone ridge reshaped, implants placed, fixed teeth attached. You go home with teeth.

1 VISIT · 4-6 HRS

4 Healing

Soft foods at first. Check-ups at one week, one month, and three months while the implants fuse to the bone.

3-6 MONTHS

THEN, IF YOU CHOSE FOUNDATION

Your temporary teeth are adjusted and re-tightened once healing is done. Around month nine we talk about upgrading to zirconia, before the 12-month price change.

IF YOU CHOSE ZIRCONIA OR ENHANCED

Records, then a try-in where you approve the shape, size, and color, then delivery. Adjustments are included for a full year afterwards.

IF YOU UPGRADE LATER

New scans, a try-in, and delivery of your final zirconia teeth. The \$4,999 price applies within 12 months of your surgery.

What could change your price

These are not part of the base price. Whether any of them apply to you is a finding from your exam and 3D scan, not a sales decision. Anything that applies is shown on your written plan before treatment starts.

ITEM	TYPICAL FEE	WHEN IT APPLIES
Sleep sedation (IV)	\$1,500-\$3,500	If you would rather sleep through surgery than be awake and numb. Depends on your medical history. Optional.
Difficult extractions	\$1,000-\$3,000	Teeth broken off at the gum line, stuck under the bone, or that have to come out in pieces.
Larger bone graft or sinus lift	\$2,000-\$5,000	When there is not enough bone, or the sinus floor has to be lifted before implants can go in.
Extra implants, beyond four	\$1,500-\$2,500 each	When your bone is soft, or your arch is wide and needs more support.
Angled implant placement	\$2,500-\$5,000	Placing implants at an angle to reach denser, stronger bone.
Implants anchored further back	\$3,000-\$7,500	Anchoring into dense bone toward the back of the jaw. Often avoids a graft and months of extra healing.
Titanium-reinforced zirconia	\$4,000-\$6,000	A metal framework inside the zirconia, for a very heavy bite or grinding.
Spare temporary set	\$500	An extra or replacement temporary set at the Foundation stage.
Backup set to keep at home	\$1,500-\$3,000	A spare arch. Worth considering if you travel often or live out of state.
Scans and records for a later upgrade	Quoted in writing	Needed when you upgrade to zirconia and your original records are out of date.
Annual maintenance plan	\$395-\$595 / year	We remove and deep-clean your teeth, check that everything is still tight, and take an X-ray. Enrolling keeps your warranty active.

What happens, and what could change your price

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Paying for treatment

Financing

Most people finance this rather than pay in full. We work with third-party health care lenders offering terms from 24 to 144 months.

We can run a soft pre-approval in the office before you commit to anything. It does not affect your credit score.

Your approval, rate, and monthly payment depend on your credit and the amount financed.

Ask us for the monthly payment on each of the four options, side by side. Comparing monthly figures rather than totals often makes the right choice obvious.

Questions to ask anyone quoting you

- ? Is this price per arch, or for both jaws?
- ? Does the price cover the temporary teeth, the final teeth, or both?
- ? Is sedation included, or billed separately?
- ? What will maintenance cost me every year after this?
- ? What is the warranty, how long does it last, and what voids it?
- ? Who is doing the surgery, and will I meet them before I sign anything?

A WORD ABOUT DECIDING

This is a large decision and there is no reason to make it in the chair. Take this home. Compare it with anything else you have been quoted, line by line, using the questions above. If a competing quote is cheaper, bring it to us — we would rather talk you through the difference than have you guess at it.

Your treatment recommendation and your final fee are determined after a clinical examination, 3D imaging, and treatment planning, and may be higher than the figures shown. Prices are stated per arch. Additional procedures, advanced surgical techniques, sedation, ongoing maintenance, repairs, and upgrades are priced separately as listed on page 3. Individual results vary; no specific outcome is promised or guaranteed. A separate consent form covering the risks of surgery in full is reviewed and signed with you before treatment.

Insurance

Most dental plans cap what they pay each year at \$1,000 to \$2,000, which does not go far against full-arch treatment.

Some plans contribute toward extractions or preparatory work. We will tell you what your plan is likely to cover rather than promise a number we cannot deliver.

Florida Medicaid covers simple extractions and basic dentures for adults, but does not cover dental implants.

Where this price sits

Ask for every quote in writing, itemized, and check what is missing from it rather than only comparing the headline number.

A cheaper quote is often cheaper because it stops at the temporary teeth, excludes sedation, or leaves out the annual maintenance. Those costs do not disappear; they arrive later.
